Identifying Amos Hall Fortner

Candace Fountoulakis of The Plano Conservancy for Historic Preservation, Inc. has a picture she would like identified. (Top Photo) She and others think it is that of Amos Hall Fortner (1844-1912), but she cannot find proof. There is no other photo of him besides the one of the group in *Plano*, the Early Years, 44 Club. Can anyone positively identify this man? The man in this portrait is not identified.

Here are a few notes on Amos Hall Fortner. He was the second white child born in Dallas and the first to live to become an adult. Amos fought in Company K of the 19th Texas Cavalry, Parson Brigade, Burford's Regiment. He moved outside of Plano proper and lived on a farm on the west side, possibly in the 'Collinwood House.' The latter is not confirmed and should not be taken as fact. Later Amos moved into town and lived in the Morten or Norton House. Amos died in 1912 and was buried in Plano's Old City Cemetery. His remains were later disinterred and moved to Restland Cemetery. His wife died in 1944. One of his daughters married a Mr. Norton and another married a Carpenter. There are many Fortner families still living in Plano.

His brother is Benjamin F. Fortner and he is identified in his portrait. (Below)

There should be more published this week on the Collinwood House since where Fortner is supposed to have lived since the proposal for its preservation and restoration was submitted this week.
