### **Neglecting Clearlake Cemetery Is Disgraceful**

Those buried at Clearlake Cemetery in Collin County, Texas, are among the early settlers who settled the area around 1880-1884. The cemetery sits on Lavon Lake inside the domain of the Corps of Engineers. Access is limited during flooding and other times, but may be given access by first calling the Corps for permission to enter. The four-foot chain link fence is in need of repair as is the front gate. Weeds are taking over the burial site. The cemetery was well taken care of for two or three generations, but as descendants neared their 80s, the younger ones moved away, and caretakers Mr. and Mrs. Smith passed away, it fell in need of repair and a good cleanup. I pray a volunteer group will take the care of the cemetery under their wing so it will once again become the dignified cemetery it used to be. Those buried there were good people.
