4H-er Martha Ruth Masters was pictured in the March issue of Progressive Farmer magazine. She said that sewing her own clothes gives her more to wear and a better fit.

Plano Masonic Lodge No. 768 held a George Washington birthday party Thursday night.

Coach Rogers said Plano is making preparations for the Collin County Boys and Girls championship cage tournament.
