#### 1927 Tornado—Nevada, Texas

NEVADA, TEXAS - 1927 TORNADO Nevada is on Farm Road 1138 two miles east of Lavon Lake in southeastern Collin County. The first organized community in the area was McMinn Chapel, established in the early 1840s four miles north of the site of present Nevada. For the most part the residents of the Community were the family and friends of its founder, John McMinn.

In 1861 Granville Stinebaugh moved to Texas from Missouri and purchased 160 acres of land near McMinn Chapel. Shortly thereafter the town of Nevada was established on his farm and named by Stinebaugh in honor of Nevada Territory, which he had passed through on his way to search for gold in California. The town received a post office on August 3, 1880. Eight years later the tracks of the St. Louis Southwestern Railway reached the community and the town incorporated in 1889.

#### Disaster Struck at 3:00 AM

Then on May 9,1927, a tornado struck the town at 3:00 A.M. as most of its citizens lay sleeping. Twenty-seven people were killed, seventy-five were injured. The town would never recover. The Baptist Church served as a temporary morgue.

Struck Garland First, Killed 13

The Nicholson Memorial Hall was created through a donation by W. R. Nicholson of Longview, Texas in memory of his mother, Missouri A, Nicholson, and his brother, S. E. Nicholson (former Garland Mayor). Both were killed in the deadly 1927 tornado that swept through Garland.

Seven members of the Smiley family were at home when the tornado roared through Garland. In the aftermath of the storm, parents, Charles and Belle Smiley, and 3 of their 5 daughters, Lilath, Greeta, and Charlena, all lay dead. The surviving daughters Dorit and Mar-

garet Ruth Smiley were taken to the hospital in Dallas, where they recovered. There is a tombstone in Mills Cemetery memorializing five members cf the Smiley family, who were all killed in the "Garland Cyclone" of May 9, 1927. Out of the thirteen dead, no family lost more members than the Smiley family Image courtesy Community ISD.

#### (By Associated Press).

NEVADA, May 9 .- Sixteen persons were killed and 50 injured when a tornado struck this town of about 800 population at about 3 o'clock this morning. Some of the injured are expected to die. Practically the entire business district, including 15 brick buildings were destroyed. The Odd Fellows Hall is the only building in section standing. The dead are: Mrs. R. C. Evans, 22; Mrs. J. T. Lemons, 45; Mrs. R. B. Craft, 65; baby of Will Vaughn; Mrs. Etta Vaughn; Miss Pauline Martin, 15; J. R. Robinson, 64; J. D. Cope, age 66; Gladys Lemons, age 12; Mrs. Bessie Tackett, and two Tackett children; Mrs. J. M. Wilson, age 50; Mrs. J. C. Johnson, and two negro children. The First Baptist and First Methodist churches were badly damaged. Remains of the Baptist church have been converted into a temporary hospital. The school house was destroyed and damage is estimated at about one million dollars. Relief train was rushed from Greenville.
