This is the first article in a series beginning with the December issue of Genealogy Friends' Newsletter, www.genealogyfriends.org, in which I report what I read in the old issues of The Plano Star Courier Newspaper, beginning with the 1953 issue. As a native of Collin County I feel Plano histories in particular always ignore the 1950s through the 1980s. I hope Flashback—Tracing Our Collin County Roots fills that void. I won't be rewriting history, just reporting what appeared in the newspaper. I will mention some of the things going on such as births, deaths, marriages, visits of townspeople and their guests, people graduating from high school, people in piano recitals, even a few of the local store advertisements, a brief mention of politicians running for office, and some of the movies showing at the local Palace movie theatre referred to as 'the show.' I hope it is a fun article acquainting the reader with the old settlers of Plano and giving a sense of the environment back then.

p. 1. It's dry in Plano. A two-inch rain fell in Plano yesterday. Each drop was two inches apart. Rev. Lenton Poss preached at the morning and evening services at the Christian Church. Mrs. Poss and son Michael are visiting her family in Temple.

The Freeze-Ette Ice Cream and Drive-In opened Tuesday in Plano at 1102 S. Avenue K just south of the Cotton Belt Railroad. The Freeze-Ette roly poly clown will welcome visitors.

The Belleview Addition just started in NE Plano near the elementary school that has started up [Mendenhall Elementary]. It will have curb and gutters. Proclaims Plano's motto, "Plano, where everybody is somebody."

Mrs. Jewel Raby's Funeral was held at the Christian Church in Allen. The service was conducted by Rev. Roscoe Bell and Rev. C. C. Geen. Burial in Allen Cemetery. Mrs. Raby was born in Allen, Feb. 22, 1901 and is the daughter of T. F. and Mary (Mankins) McMillen.

Mr. and Mrs. Homer Adams travel to Hopkins County Sunday where he is the Memorial Day speaker. Rev. A. W. Peirce of Plano preaches at the Fannie Harrington Chapel in NW Plano each third Sunday. The church celebrates 50 years on August 16.
