Genealogy Class at Collin College


Genealogy III will be offered at Collin College (formerly Collin County Community College) Courtyard Campus, 4800 Preston Park Blvd. Plano, TX 75093, on Wednesday nights from January 17 to Feb 21, 2018 from 6:30 to 9:00 pm.

Genealogy III focuses on breaking down genealogy brick walls. Class topics include using census records before 1850, researching female ancestors, sorting out records when there are multiple people in the same area with the same name, getting around burned courthouses, and analyzing problems. In this class you will learn how to analyze and interpret records, use indirect evidence, and plan research. This class is designed for students who have experience researching their family history.

Microsoft OneNote Tip

OneNote is an electronic notebook. It is great for creating research plans, research logs, and research reports.

into your OneNote notebook in a variety of ways. If you have a file that contains info

If you have a file that contains information that you want to store in your research notes you can use the File Printout command.

Place your cursor on the page and click on File Printout on the Insert menu. Locate the file you want to use and click Insert. The contents of the file will be placed on your OneNote notebook page.
