Writing Your Family History

How to write your autobiography or family history, one story at a time, is something Austin College professors Jerry Lincecum and Peggy Redshaw have been teaching out-of-school adults for 25 years. Their program is called Telling Our Stories (TOS) and what they teach is how to move beyond a family tree or set of genealogical facts to craft a story. By answering simple questions in a workshop format and converting memories into short narratives, the participants are encouraged to record their family history.

Sharing these personal stories orally in a workshop setting is fun and it encourages remembering and writing the stories down. Since 1990 TOS has sponsored the publication of a dozen books of story collections, and two-dozen individuals have written and published their own books as a result of participating in the program. After introductory remarks, they will provide prompts for stories as well as writing exercises. Books will be available for sale afterward.



Using Microsoft OneNote for Genealogy

Saturday February 27 and March 5, 2016 from 8:30-12:30

OneNote, a free digital notebook for multiple platforms, is a great compliment to your genealogy program. This is a hands on class. Bring your laptop with OneNote installed on it or use a school computer and bring your own usb drive with genealogy information, notes, pictures, etc on it and create a notebook to keep your family history research plans and notes organized.

Genealogy II

Eight Wednesdays—January 6 through February 24, 2016 from 6:30 to 9:00

This course focuses of different records used to bring your family members to life, including land records, tax records, military records, immigration records, court records, probate records and wills, and maps and directories. Students will learn how to locate the records—both online and in offline repositories, what they can add to your family history and how to interpret them. We'll also cover research planning and documentation. The class is designed for those who have completed the Introduction to Genealogy class, those returning to genealogy or experienced researchers who want to refresh their skills.
