Plano's newest housing development begins on east Farm to Market Road (FM) 544 says developer George Cox and Company of Plano and Dallas. The development of the 126 lot all-brick home development is prompted by the development of the 1957 extension of Central Expressway thourgh Plano to McKinney.

Mr. Lemons was married to Miss Mary Katherine Kimbrell in Rockwall, who survives him. Surviving are one son, Randy age 8, his parents Mr. and Mrs. Frank Lemons of Sachse, two brothers and three sisters.

The overall average for the team is 338.


