

## Writing Ancestry.com Citations Unlocked

It takes a compilation of all the information found to make an interesting family history. You determine the result. *You* alone are responsible for the quality of your research and for properly mapping where you found the information. You must make order out of the chaos when writing citations.

Today, most all of us research on the Internet. Furthermore, Ancestry.com is likely the most searched database. Their database falls into six types of images:

Original records or films of previously published printed material Records previously published by other parties Created by Ancestry Ancestry's consolidated databases from others Abstracts and OCR text and transcriptions by created by Ancestry Ancestry's own writers' instructional article

Since citations are a map that verifies statements by listing the original source or by enhancing the text, each citation must be prepared properly. It shows Ancestry.com sample citations in three styles: Source List Entry, Full Reference Note, and Short Reference Note.

Remembering the accepted form for proper footnotes is often difficult. Finding the correct form can be time-consuming. Using the right QuickSheet correctly shows you in this 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 11" laminated folder by Elizabeth Mills' *Citing Ancestry.com Databases & Images Evidence Style* is available from Genealogical.com. The examples show how to make order out of chaos by citing a full reference note using Ancestry's product and sources with a basic template plus models for common record types.
